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Executive Committee Member Focus

1) Gerald. Please tell Bits and Bytes about your current position at IPFW.

I have been the Associate Director at IPFW since accepting the position in September 2001. Since my audience is in the FA profession I think you know that we do it all, not just as Associate Directors. I have program responsibilities, committee meetings, provide support for the director, supervision, compliance issues, meet with students and parents, department interaction, read updates, other duties as assigned, etc. I love this profession and think I have the best FA office staff.



2) How did you get your start in Financial Aid?

You talk to people all the time who say that such and such a career had been their hearts desire since... you fill in the blank, and they are in that career as an adult. Well, you might find this hard to believe but ever since I was knee high to a grasshopper I always wanted to be a fireman. You can see that part of my dream has come true; I am putting out fires almost daily. Yes, it is an exciting career and always challenging. I think each year we face more changes than the 2008 US Presidential elections ever promised. Now how did I get started in FA, what happens to most of us, I just fell into it. I was working at Northern Arizona University when a position opened in FA and I thought that looks much more exciting then working in the Business Office. The rest is now history. I think it was love at first SAR Pell Payment Voucher paper cut.

3) Tell us about your current role with ISFAA and being on executive committee.

I am the Internal Operations and Management Commissioner. It sounds very impressive especially with the position description stating I am "responsible for managing the general activities of the corporation as related to finance, membership, voting, by-laws and other areas deemed necessary." which sounded a bit overwhelming when I first considered serving in this position. What I really do is help coordinate activities and direction from the Executive Committee with a fantastic group of Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs with their committee action plans. The Executive Committee members are supportive and I think all actually serve on other committees than just their position so there is always room for you to volunteer. Did I tell you that I am excited about our association and the opportunities it provides for all of us? Yes, I just did.

4) You have been involved with financial aid since 1986. Do you have a memory about a student you helped that stands out in your mind that shows the good work that FA folks do?

What person who has been in this profession doesn't have stories about student success. This is one of the areas that really make this profession worthwhile. I have had several student workers continue on into the Financial Aid profession which is always great. There have been many students I have watched overcome obstacles and difficult situation to achieve their educational dream. My fondest memory is with a non-traditional student who had not completed high school, raised her family working minimum pay jobs, had a poor self image and little self confidence, etc. She came to a community college fair being held at a shopping mall where I meet her and helped to start her toward her goal of getting a college education. She completed her GED and I helped her with the financial aid process at the community college, hired her as a student worker, and had the joy in watching her grow into a confident person overcoming a background that told her she couldn't do it. She completed her associate degree and went on for a bachelor degree.

5) Tell us about other leadership roles you've had involving financial aid.

One area to mention here is our local Financial Aid Administrators meetings. We go by the Northeastern Indiana Financial Aid Administrators (NEIFAA), not an official organization. Each year I have organized a set of monthly meetings for our local financial aid community. We meet at lunch time rotating around the area campuses. It has been a plus for me to get to know others in the profession and individuals in support services on a regular basis. We share information, concerns, laughs, and sometimes incorporate a training program. I have found it a time in helping to ease the stress we face in the financial aid area and increasing my networking resources. I would encourage other areas to get this type of program going.

6) You joined ISFAA in 2002. Please share your thoughts about the organization after almost a decade as a member.

It is a great organization because we have the best people in Indiana in our profession.

7) What is your favorite thing about your profession?

This is easy for me, working with students and seeing them achieve their educational goals is number one.

8) Do you have a least favorite thing about your profession that you will share?

A parent who wants to do it all for their child, this is hard when it is a dependent but when you have a 24 year old "independent" student who doesn't have the time to work on their financial aid!! SSACI News

Professional Judgment (PJ), SSACI Awards and xGrads Changes

Throughout the hustle and bustle that comes along with processing student awards for the 2010-11 school year, and the normal verifications, college choice changes, and other information needing to be updated on a student's ISIRs, many students have had, or will have, Professional Judgment (PJ) rendered on their FAFSAs by their school's Financial Aid Administrator (FAA). While there are several areas that can be considered for Professional Judgment, there are two primary ones that can impact a student's eligibility for SSACI awards. They are:

- **Dependency Status (SSACI Edit 18)**
- **Parental Contribution/Expected Family Contribution (SSACI Edit 19)**

Once you have submitted a transaction marked as a PJ to the CPS, for SSACI purposes, an additional step must be taken (discussed in the next section). Not all dependency status and PC/EFC PJs are accepted by SSACI. A list of acceptable and non-acceptable PJs can be found in the document "Professional Judgment and SSACI", located in the Information Files section of xGrads.

Clearing PJs for SSACI; the additional step(s)

When your PJ transaction is submitted to the CPS and downloaded to SSACI's database (usually within 3-5 days), the student's account, if there are no others edits outstanding, will be placed into a WAIT status and an Edit 18 (dependency status) or 19 (PC/EFC adjustment) will be

placed on the student's account. WAIT is just what it says; SSACI is waiting for you to provide the reason for the PJ, known as a PJ reason code. The code can be submitted to SSACI one of two ways; either via the file transfer process (where the PJ reason can be coded in the appropriate field in your APPL, NOTF or RECN file), or the xGrads homepage, where you can click the ## Professional Judgments link (where ## represents the number of students at your school awaiting PJ codes to be assigned to their SSACI accounts) to search for your students. Note: In the spring term, when file processing for the current academic year (RECN phase) and upcoming academic year (APPL phase) overlap, schools can provide PJ codes for both years by means of the appropriate file transfer or via xGrads.

So.....what's going on before I provide the reason code?

As mentioned above, the student's account is placed into a WAIT status while SSACI is awaiting the PJ reason code. During this time, the student's PC/EFC and/or dependency status is "locked" in place until the PJ reason code is provided, with SSACI taking the PC/EFC and/or dependency status from the previous ISIR transaction and placing it into the xGrads-Professional Judgment "Values if Rejected" category while awaiting the reason code, and assigning the PC/EFC and/or dependency status from the PJ transaction into the xGrads-Professional Judgment "Values if Accepted" category.

We encourage you to code the PJ reason as soon as the appropriate transaction is received at SSACI from the CPS, and to refrain from initiating additional transactions for the student until you accept or reject the pending PJ.

What codes do you need to provide?

Both Edits 18 and 19 have acceptable and non-acceptable PJ reason codes that you will need in order to code a student's PJ reason and clear their account for award processing and/or creation. A list of PJ reason codes can be found in the document "Professional Judgment and SSACI", located in the Information Files section of xGrads

OK, I've provided the reason code; What next?

After the PJ reason code has been provided on the student's account, the WAIT status is released. If the PJ reason is acceptable for SSACI purposes, the PC/EFC or dependency status will be updated based on the transaction the PJ was initiated on. If the PJ reason is not acceptable for SSACI purposes, the PC/EFC and dependency status will remain that of the transaction prior to the PJ transaction.

The PC/EFC is not the one I need to use for award purposes, what should I do?

Once the PJ transaction is received by

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SSACI, the student's account is "locked" until a PJ reason code is provided. If you wish to use a PC/EFC from a transaction in between the PJ transaction and the transaction you provided a reason code on, you will need to submit a new transaction to the CPS that replicates the data from the transaction you want to use.

Odd situations

Occasionally, odd situations may occur where a student has multiple PJ circumstances, one that SSACI accepts and one that SSACI does not. In these situations, process two separate PJ transactions, the first for the unacceptable SSACI PJ reason code (99). and the next for the acceptable SSACI PJ reason. Submit the initial PJ transaction for the unacceptable reason to the CPS; when

it is received at SSACI, clear the WAIT status with the reason code 99. Submit the next PJ transaction to the CPS; when it is received at SSACI, clear the WAIT status with the acceptable reason code, and we will calculate an award with these adjustments in place. Please try to process these transactions next to one another; if they are not processed in this manner, you may have to work with SSACI to have things corrected.

Finally, a new look for the Information Files section of xGrads

The "Information Files" section of xGrads has a new look that we hope will provide quicker and easier access to SSACI files and documents for our college partners. Building on our August 2010 cleanup of files that removed outdated files and re-

duced the number of files from 70 to 43, SSACI will be organizing files by topic-specific categories. Each category will have a header, and appropriate files will be placed within the category. We hope this enhancement, as well as other enhancements made to xGrads and other SSACI systems throughout the course of the year continue meet the needs of our college partners and the students you serve.

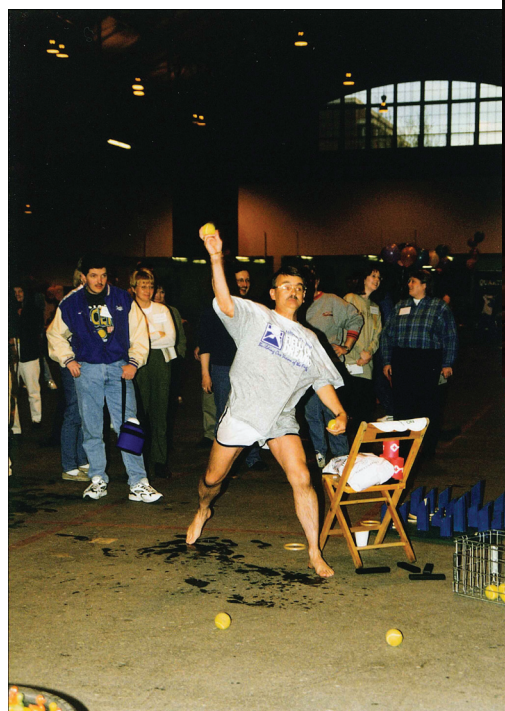

PUT the Pieces Together

Through the Ensuring Continued Access to Student Loans Act (HR 5715) the Department of Education (ED) created the Loan Purchase Commitment Program. This program granted ED the authority to purchase eligible Federal Family Education Loan Program (FFELP) loans from lenders, thereby freeing up funds for lenders to make new loans during the capital markets disruption.

Loans that have been purchased are considered "PUT" and become ED-owned loans. The final phase of eligibility for this program affects Stafford, PLUS, and GradPLUS loans made during the 2009-2010 academic year that are fully disbursed by September 30, 2010. As of July 2010, both PUT loans and Direct Loans now reside on the servicing platforms of the Title IV Additional Servicers (TIVAS). With multiple servicers in the mix, it is important for schools to understand the types of loans a student may hold, as well as the designated servicer(s) for those loans.

PUT loans have been and will continue to be assigned to one of the four TIVAS. Add the original Direct Loan servicer (ACS) to the mix, and there are five potential players in the servicing arena. Schools do not have the option of choosing a servicing partner. Keep in mind that once a loan is sold (PUT loans), the original lender and/or guarantor are no longer the contact for the school; the assigned servicer assumes management of all aspects of the loan.

Servicer assignments are made for PUT loans when the sale of the loan to ED is complete. Servicer assignments for Direct Loans are made after the first disbursement of the loan. Schools will need to determine which

servicer(s) has been assigned to their respective students. This information can be accessed via NSLDS or any specific servicer's reporting tool. There is no centralized method for the return of funds for PUT loans. The return of funds must go through the specific servicer's ED-assigned lockbox (an address unique to each servicer).

The borrower is also impacted when a loan is PUT due to the possibility of a servicer change. If that occurs, a paper "Welcome Letter" notifies the borrower of the change in loan ownership. Students should be counseled to utilize NSLDS if there are questions pertaining to the ownership of their loan(s). Keep in mind that combined billing is not an option for students who hold both ED-owned and commercially owned FFELP loans. In this situation, split servicing is a possibility. ED can only assign a student's ED-owned loans to a single servicer; ED has no authority over commercially owned FFELP loans with regard to servicing.

The following information will assist you in determining which of the TIVAS are servicing your students' loans. NSLDS will reflect the following information:

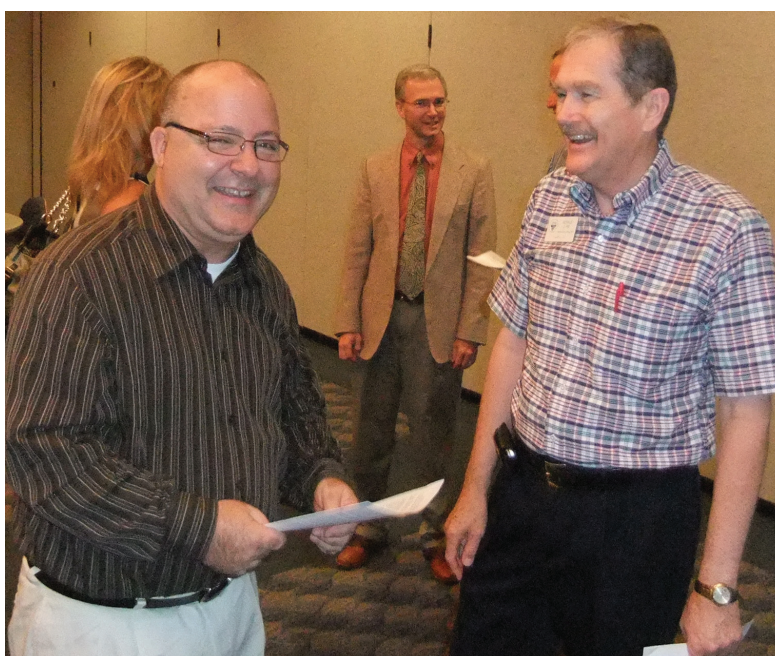
