



A recent study regarding the issuance of debt letters to help student debt levels indicated the "information alone is not sufficient to systematically different borrowing choices among students and that other supports are likely necessary to affect behavior." Indiana University has taken significant steps to ensure the information provided in the debt letter is supported by a comprehensive financial literacy program that assists students in making informed financial decisions.
