### What is Verification?

- Process of verifying accuracy of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) data
- Students are selected for verification in one of two ways:
  - ► By CPS
    - ► Groups!
  - ► By institution
    - ▶ Institution can decide what items to verify & the documentation to gather
- Student may not opt out of the verification process if eligible for need-based aid

## Rules to Live By - ED Regulations

- Federal regulations 34 CFR 668.51 61
  - ► These regulations govern the verification by institutions of information submitted by applicants for financial aid purposes
  - Provides instruction on:
    - ► The selection process
    - ► Acceptable documentation
    - Deadlines

## **Groupings - History**

- Introduced in the 2013-2014 award year
  - Added high school completion and identity/statement of educational purpose
- Customized approach to verification
- FAFSA information that must be verified
  - ▶ Will vary from applicant-to-applicant
  - ▶ May be information that is not used in calculating applicant's EFC
  - May change from award year to award year
- ► ED publishes a notice in Federal Register each year detailing the FAFSA information subject to verification

## Tracking Groups

- Determined each year by ED
  - ► Federal Register, generally in June each year
  - ▶ 1819 information released May 5<sup>th</sup>, Vol 82 No 86
- V1 Standard Verification
- V2 SNAP (retired in 1415)
- ▶ V3 Child Support Paid (retired in 1617)
- V4 Custom Verification Group
- ► V5 Aggregate (combine V1 and V4 = V5 clever!)
- ▶ V6 Household Resources (retired in 1718)

## Group 1 Verification Items 1718

#### Tax Filers

- Adjusted gross income
- US taxes paid
- Untaxed portion of IRS distributions
- Untaxed portion of pensions
- ► IRA deductions and payments
- Tax-exempt interest income
- Education credits
- Household size
- Number in college

#### Non-Filers

- Income earned from work
- Household size
- Number in college
- Statement of non-filing

## Group 4 Verification Items - 1718

- High school completion
- Identity/Statement of Educational Purpose
  - ► Must use language provided by ED for Statement. Language cannot be adjusted/changed in any way
  - Government issued ID must be presented and witnessed
  - Signature on Statement must be witnessed

## Group 5 Verification Items - 1718

► Marriage of Group 1 and Group 4

## The Future - 1819 Verification

- ► Federal Register vol. 82 No. 86
  - ► Issued May 5, 2017
  - ► Groups for 1718 carried forward to 1819
  - ▶ DRT (hopefully!) and TRT will be the acceptable documentation acceptance of paper tax return goes away
- ► New!
  - ► Auto Zero EFC Verification requirements lessened

# Verification Policies and Procedures

- > 34 CFR 668.53
- Institution must establish and use written policies and procedures for verifying an applicant's FAFSA information. Must include
  - ▶ Time period within which applicant must provide documentation
  - ▶ How applicant will be notified of need for verification documentation
  - Consequences of failure to comply
  - ► Applicant notification procedures of verification results
- Need to be consistently applied
- Need to be reviewed and updated annually

# Conflicting Information - Resolution

- Not to be confused with Verification, this is a separate ED requirement
- > 34 CFR 668.16(f)
- > 34 CFR 668.54(a)(2)
- Regardless of verification selection, must always resolve discrepancies and conflicting information
- Examples
  - Student files on FAFSA has HS diploma, but admissions says no diploma was earned
  - Student turns in tax transcript even though not selected for verification
